Program Descriptions

The Lee Fire Department, Resident Student Internship, is an independent educational program that operates with Students of the University of New Hampshire in Durham, New Hampshire. The purpose of the program is to provide a field experience that prepares students for careers or volunteering in the Fire Service by exposing them to the principles of firefighting, EMS, Emergency Management and Homeland Security.

The Program is designed for mature, motivated students who seek to augment their academic commitment by participating in a supervised program that provides actual job experience. The internship goes well beyond observation and job shadowing and requires active participation as a firefighter/EMT in a working combination fire department.

Students are assigned to shifts that will complement the UNH academic schedule and allow for adequate study time. Students quickly learn how to balance their classes, homework and internship responsibilities through a process of planning and communications with supervisors and mentors.

Resident Students live at the Lee Fire Station in assigned student quarters.

Working along side career and call firefighters, students are exposed to the fire service culture and the community we serve.

Expectations

Students are expected to work on shift, sixteen hours per week. In addition to the scheduled shift work, students also respond to calls

whenever they are at the station and in accordance with academic requirements. Students are expected to participate in a positive and professional manner at all times. The department

holds two meetings a month, on the second and fourth Thursday of the month. Students are required to attend both meetings. Students are eligible for call pay based on an hourly rate for emergencies responded to. Students selected for the program are required to sign an agreement for two semesters that demonstrates a mutual understanding of the program requirements.

Qualifications

Candidates for the Lee Fire Resident Student program shall be eighteen years old on or before January 1, 2009 and enrolled as a full time student in a UNH program. Resident Student must maintain a 2.5 average while enrolled in the internship. Candidates will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- Cover Letter
- Resume
- Town of Lee Employment Application
- Criminal Background Check
- Two personal references
- Provide a copy of Physical Exam by a Physician allowing participation as a FF

- Successful Completion of LF&R Physical Ability Test

- Firefighter I Certification- Strongly Recommended

- National Registry EMT Certification- Strongly Recommended

- CPR Certification- Strongly Recommended

- Experience with Fire-EMS Explorers or Jr. Fire Department

- Experience with call fire department

Students provide: bedding or sleeping bag, steel toed station foot wear (black), personal hygiene items, school and off duty clothing and school supplies. Space is limited—bring only essentials. Students provide their own meals using the station kitchen. A parking space for the
